

Policy Updates for 2025

Pace of Play & Guests



Pace of Play Expectation: Adjusted to **4:10** per round (previously 4:05), with a tighter 10-minute grace period for delays.

Friday Guest Policy: Guest play will now begin at **2:00 PM** instead of 1:00 PM, allowing more access for members.

As the season unfolds, we will review guest policies based on access to

the tee by our members. We appreciate everyone's cooperation in making Cedar Brae a club where rounds are fair, fast, and enjoyable for all.

Focus on Couples

We're always looking for ways to elevate the club experience, and this season, we're introducing new opportunities for couples to enjoy the game together.

First, we're launching a monthly **Nine & Dine Couples** event—a fun, social way to enjoy a relaxed round followed by a great meal. We still need to lock down dates, but we're looking at starting in late May/early June. Stay tuned for more details.

We're also revamping the Couples Open and the Learie Shield tournaments by merging them into a bigger and better event: **The Learie Shield Open**, set for **June 21**.

The Learie Shield is Cedar Brae's longest-standing tournament, with a legacy spanning over a century. Thomas W. Learie and his wife were instrumental in shaping the club's early years, and in 1924, the tournament was introduced in their honour. This season, we're building on that tradition—preserving its rich history while introducing a fresh, revitalized experience.

What Can you Expect?

- No more "ladies ask men" for partners—open sign-ups for all!
- Singles welcome! The Pro Shop will help find a partner.
- **Scotch 2-ball** format (male/female teams).
- **2:00 PM Shotgun**, leading into a gala dinner event.

New Drop Zones!

New drop zones will be introduced on holes **#6** and **#16**, complementing the existing one on hole **#4**–all strategically placed across the river.

These drop zones are designed to provide a better experience for players with higher handicaps, eliminating the need to re-tee after a lost ball while reducing intimidation, improving pace of play, and keeping scores in check. The goal is simple: make the game more enjoyable for everyone.

Tackling Sticky Issues

Ensuring enjoyable and efficient rounds is a top priority, and the Captain's Committee is addressing two key challenges: **pace of play** and **tee sheet management**.

Slow Play Enforcement

To keep rounds moving, we're reinforcing the **Pace of Play Policy** as outlined in the Golf Handbook. The process for slow play violations will be as follows:

- **1st Offense:** Meet with the Head Pro, Club Captain and/or Men's/Ladies' Captain to discuss ways to improve pace and review enforcement policy.
- **2nd Offense:** A documented meeting with General manager, Club Captain and Head Pro. If deemed appropriate, a two-week suspension from tee time bookings will be imposed.
- 3rd Offense: Automatic two-week suspension from tee time bookings.

Let's play efficiently and keep the game moving!

Tee Sheet Manipulation & No-Show Policy

Holding a **prime-time** tee time and failing to show up is unfair to other members. The Golf Shop tracks all **no-shows** and the use of false names ("dummy" bookings) and reports them to the Club Captain or General Manager for appropriate action. More detail is contained in our Rules & Regulations document, but please be aware of the following:

- New Cancellation Deadline: Tee times must be canceled by 2:00PM the day before your scheduled round.
- Enforcement:

1. First Offence

The member who made the booking will receive an email from the Club Captain outlining the details and issuing a first warning.

2. Second Offence

The member will be asked to meet with the Club Captain and Head Pro to review the infraction and go over the club's booking policies. They'll be advised that further violations may lead to a two-week suspension of playing privileges.

3. Third Offence

The member will be asked to meet with the General Manager, Club Captain and Head Pro to review the

infraction and, if deemed appropriate, will impose a **two-week suspension** from tee bookings. A formal letter will be sent by the General Manager, and a copy will be kept on file for one year. Further violations may result in stronger sanctions.

It's a busy tee sheet, so let's all play fair, play ready golf and keep a steady pace to ensure an enjoyable round for everyone on the course!
